BEST PRACTICES OF THE INSTITUTION

1. SOCIALLY INNOVATIVE LEARNING PROGRAMMES

This is one of the innovative strategies used in core subject classrooms to arouse creativity, critical thinking, and communication skill and to develop their full potentials. This programme is conducted with the support and co-operation of all optional subjects. Here students convert classrooms into work stations where the participation of each and every student is ensured. Different varieties of activities are chalked out with the objective of fulfilling holistic personality development. They learn a lot of life skills through this technique. To enhance general knowledge, quizzing sessions are conducted every day. Each optional subject is assigned a particular day for conducting quiz. Students are asked to familiarise with the news paper of the previous day for which the quiz is conducted. Every day, prizes are also given. This serves as a motivation and re inforcement for the students to participate actively. To develop literary skills, "Read a book" programme is also arranged periodically. Here books are selected according to their interest in the literary areas.

2. FOOD FEST

It is organised annually where students sell homemade cuisines and the income generated thereby is utilised for charity purposes. A portion of it is contributed to the needy students of our institution. As a part of social commitment, students serve as resource persons in their locality, wherein several of their hard skills that they imbibed through the classrooms such as "Tie and Dye, Bag making, Ornament making are utilised for the benefit of the community.

3. ONE HOBBY A MONTH

Hobbies are personal interests of an individual for personality development. Titus II Teachers college has always been instrumental in augmenting the academic and personal talents of the students to its fullest level. With this intention, the Natural Science Optional students designed a programme titled 'One Hobby a Month'. Here for the first month, the hobby initiated

was review a book. This programme was organised for the whole student community. Here the students selected the book according to their choice. They read the book for one month and the review is carried out on a particular day. The best reviewer is awarded a prize. For the next month, photography competition based on a theme is carried out. Here students capture photos with their own mobile camera and the images are send for evaluation at a judge's desk with the stipulated norms. The best images are awarded with prize.

4. MATHS MART

Students of Mathematics optional run a stationery store named Maths Mart. Here learning support materials like charts, pen and pencil, bond papers, A4 size papers of different colours, paper files, sanitary napkins and short eats are also sold. It acts as an oasis in times of emergencies. The income generated from this is used for charity. As the work of charity, with the money collected learning aids are provided to the adopted school.

5. TECH-SUPPORT SYSTEM

Value based short films, documentaries and videos prepared by students under the supervision of teachers are developed to enrich classroom practices.

6. CO-SCHOLASTIC ACTIVITIES

Several competitions at the Intra- and Inter level on Arts, Literary, and Sports are held to ensure a wholesome personality in learners. Social commitment is developed through planned visits to destitute homes, serving meals for the needy, collection and disbursebent of clothes and other materials to the community.

7. ENHANCEMENT OF READING SKILL

Regular quiz programmes on current events to encourage news paper reading among teacher educands are a common feature at College.

8. ORIENTATION/ INTERFACE SESSIONS

Interaction with the Heads of institutions for Teacher preparation prior to School Internship Programme eases all doubts and sets the ground for meaningful interaction with students at school.

9. DISTRIBUTION OF INSTRUCTIONAL AIDS PREPARED BY TRAINEES

The self-learning Resource Materials prepared by Teacher Trainees are given away to various schools.

REBUILD KERALA

As part of rebuild Kerala mission, a digital survey was conducted in Peringara Grama Panchayat to collect the details of damage caused due to the floods. This program was held under social service league and organized on the **26th October 2018**.

On 16 August 2018, severe floods affected the south Indian state Kerala, due to unusually high rainfall that happened during the monsoon season. It was the worst flood in Kerala in nearly a century. Over 483 people died, and 140 were missing. Almost a million people were required to evacuate from their houses.

Social Service league secretary was Jyothi S Nair and Staff In charge was Dr. Sam Thomas Joy. An extension program of Rebuild Kerala was held at Peringara panchayat. 100 students participated for the program. Their duty was to collect details from people who were suffering because of Pralayam 2018 as part of the program conducted by Jwala Union. They formed a group of Five students each as government volunteers to collect details of about 60 houses and to upload the app. Based on the details collected and submitted, they received a sanction from the panchayat for the flood relief fund. The group was guided by a representative who knew the place.

Through this program all the students became a member of Rebuild Kerala's Data Collection Wing. And lastly, they collected photos of what damages were done during the Pralayam 2018.
